• Rutgers University Libraries Announce Open Access Agreement with Elsevier – Rutgers announced a historic, transformative open-access partnership with Elsevier, a global leader in information, scientific research, and analytics. The five-year arrangement managed by the Rutgers University Libraries (RUL) will provide the Rutgers community with read access to over 4,600 journals, and enabling Rutgers researchers to publish in 1,700 hybrid journals without incurring Article Processing Charges (APCs). - Ongoing discussion revolves around Zyn, a nicotine pouch product, raising concerns about its allure
 to underage users. Ollie Ganz, from Rutgers School of Public Health, underscores the emergence
 of an online subculture surrounding Zyn, particularly driven by younger males. While certain experts
 express apprehensions regarding the possibility of Zyn appealing to teenagers, others contend that
 it could aid adults in shifting away from conventional tobacco products. For more information, click
